#### **Athletics**

Any student in grades 9-12 are welcome to join. Students learn and then compete regionally, statewide and nationally in a wide range of business subjects that are of interest to the student. #### **Student Council**

Students in grades 9-12 are welcome to run in the school-wide election to participate as elected members of the student government. Officer positions representing the student body as a whole: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and Historian. Additionally, Middle School through Senior Classes

elect a class Senator who serves as the liaison between The Student Council and his/her class. The Student Council collaborates closely with the Broadview School to plan joint events for sports, and works to better the school for its citizens.

Students are selected for application each spring based on their cumulative grade point averages. Junior Honor Society candidates must have a 3.00 GPA and National Honor Society candidates must have a 3.33 GPA to be considered for application. Selected candidates then complete an application that is scored via a national rubric by a faculty council. Successful applicants are inducted in a ceremony in the spring of each school year.

### **Middle and High School Class Advisors**

Each class has a faculty advisor who oversees any activities and fundraising for the class. During basketball season, classes sign up to work a shift at concessions.

## **Frequently Asked Questions from Parents**

### **How do I know what my child's grades are and whether any homework is missing?**

Our district uses the online grading program *Infinite Campus*. Through IC parents can see many facets of their child's academic picture including grades, attendance history, and lunch balances. District-wide messages can be accessed and you can also select to be notified by phone with pertinent information about your child and the school. Infinite Campus can be accessed through the web on your computer or through an app for your smartphone called "*Campus Parent*". To gain access to IC, please contact Julie Sperry, the District Clerk. She will give you the district identification information.

Additionally, your child's teacher always welcomes your communication. Please refer to the email list at the beginning of this guidebook.

### **What if I have concerns about homework or other academics?**

The best person to contact with academic concerns is your child's teacher. Typically, teachers will not take phone calls during instruction time because they interrupt the class. Additionally, it is often hard to maintain confidentiality during a phone call while students are in the room. The best route is to reach out via email as all teachers have school email addresses that they regularly check. You can ask a specific question or request a face-to-face meeting. All teachers are

contracted to be in the building from 7:40 am to 3:35 pm.

Advance appointments are recommended as our teachers wear many hats in a small rural school and may not always be in their classroom or available after school hours.

### **How do I access the School website? What information will I find there?**

The Lavina Public School website is [www.lavinapublicschools.com](http://www.lavinapublicschools.com), and it is a one-stop resource to access the current calendar of events, teacher and group web pages, and the latest happenings at our little school. There are also links to the student handbook and the monthly lunch menu. You can read a digital version of "What's Happening" our monthly newsletter. New material is added weekly. Please check it out!

### **How will I know if school is unexpectedly canceled due to weather or other emergency?**

The best way to get up-to-date information about the school is to maintain your access to Infinite Campus and the school website, and/or the Lavina School Facebook page.

Bus riding families may also receive an early morning phone call from their bus driver with additional information about any closures and how they will affect bus routes.

**How do I pay for my child's school meals?** School meals should be paid in advance. Prices are: Breakfast K-5 \$2.00,

6-12 \$2.25, Adults \$3.25 Lunch: Pre-K-5 \$2.25, 6-12 \$2.75, Adults \$5.00. Families may apply online for reduced/free meals.

**What should I do if my child will miss school?**

Please call the main office at 406-636-2761 if your child will be absent due to an unexpected event or illness. The office must receive notification directly from a parent or guardian of the child who will be absent.

For prearranged absences due to appointments or the like, where you know IN ADVANCE that your child will be absent, please contact the teacher as soon as possible so that your child can complete an ADVANCED MAKEUP form and get any missed assignments.

**How will I know about school concerts and what my child should wear?**

All students preschool through 5th grade participate in school concerts as part of their music education. The teacher is Miss Boehm. Lavina has been advertising for a music teacher and has not been able to find one. We will keep working on this.

**What is the “Sports Co-op”?**

In order to provide more athletic and social opportunities for our students, Broadview and Lavina formed a Sports Cooperative, which has its own separate Board. Under this Co-op, we are known as The Broadview-Lavina Pirates. Our colors are purple and black. This combination of resources

means we all benefit from shared practice spaces, transportation, finances, coaches and get to field a team! It has been very successful. This relationship also offers combined school dances for high school students several times a year. There is also an opportunity to play in the Pirate Pep Band for high school students.

**My kids are in sports, and we live outside of Lavina. How will I know when to pick them up after practice?**

Francine Jansen, our Athletic Director, sends out weekly emails with schedules for games, practice times and pick-up times in Lavina, and is posted on Facebook. Please be sure you have given the office an accurate email address so you will be included on the list. For game days, the coach will be the best contact for information about return times to Lavina. Most coaches will share their contact information at the beginning of the season.

**My kid says that s/he has to work concessions? What does that mean for me? Why is my kid working concessions?**

Concessions are expected to be made available to the public at sporting events and other activities, such as Play Day or the Holiday Bazaar. To meet this community expectation, student groups and individual classes, along with their faculty advisors, are asked to periodically work at concessions. The benefit for students is that the class or organization can keep profits for activities of the organization or class. The work at concessions REQUIRES your child be there from set-up to clean-up. Because the faculty advisor is often the only adult present, it is

*always* appreciated when any parent volunteers offers to help. Your child may be at the school as late as 10:00 PM, which is why usually only students grades 6-12 are asked to work.

The best practice is to be in contact with your child's class/organization advisor to get more details for that particular night.

The funds raised through concessions, as with other class or organization fundraisers, are used to pay for activities that the class or organization may need to fund as they move through school. It is expected that all student members of the class or organization contribute to earning money for activities as all students benefit. Here are some examples

Prom -- Junior Class typical contributes \$500  
Graduation -- expenses for decorations, speakers, etc.

Special Trips -- Expenses beyond the school contribution such as The Senior Trip or BPA National Competitions.

### **Speaking of Prom, how does that work with such a small student body?**

The High School Prom is held each April in Billings and is a joint celebration with other local small Class C Schools -- Ryegate, Rapelje, Custer, Melstone, Reed Point and Broadview. The Junior Class from each of these schools contributes \$500 to a joint prom fund from which all expenses

from music to decorations are paid. Junior Representatives from each school meeting and plan together. High School Students purchase tickets to attend. Students from non-participating schools are allowed to attend ONLY with an invitation from a participating school AND with approval from the office (see Mrs. Hanson for paperwork). Ticket sales made at the door are put into the joint prom fund. After all expenses are paid, the remaining money in the joint prom fund is equally distributed among all participating schools.

### **I am new here and overwhelmed by all the little things that happen in a small school. Is there another parent I can call if I have questions?**
